22 yo M, elite Nordic skier w/ witnessed syncopal event during a routine practice in West Yellowstone. Previously well. Reports brief episode of palpitations preceding. Travelled to Europe last week for a world cup qualifying event. R lower leg has been tender.

Denies PMH / PSH / FH / Meds or Allergies.

VSS, HR 46 & unremarkable PE.

3rd year Medical Student

“Julie is a **16yo F** who presents with **RLQ abdominal pain**. It started several days ago, but became worse after gymnastics practice yesterday. 10/10 intensity, worse with movement.

Emesis x 2, without fevers, diarrhea, or constipation. LMP 2 weeks ago. Denies PMH / PSH.

She is here with her parents and it was embarrassing to ask about sexual history, so I didn't press the issue but she does not smoke or use drugs.

She looks uncomfortable on PE, but her only significant finding is exquisite tenderness in the RLQ. I'm worried about appendicitis and think we should get a CT scan & consult surgery.”
